MIT's President Karl Compton adopted the creation of new industries as a key goal for the Institute in 1947, as mentioned in Spencer Ante's [Creative Capital](#). Seventy-two years later the aggregated annual revenues of companies started by MIT alumni is 1.9 trillion dollars. 93 Nobel Laureates, 26 Turing Award winners and 8 Fields Medalist are affiliated with MIT, despite (I could say because of) the industry orientation.

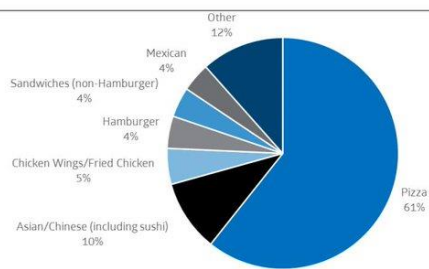
