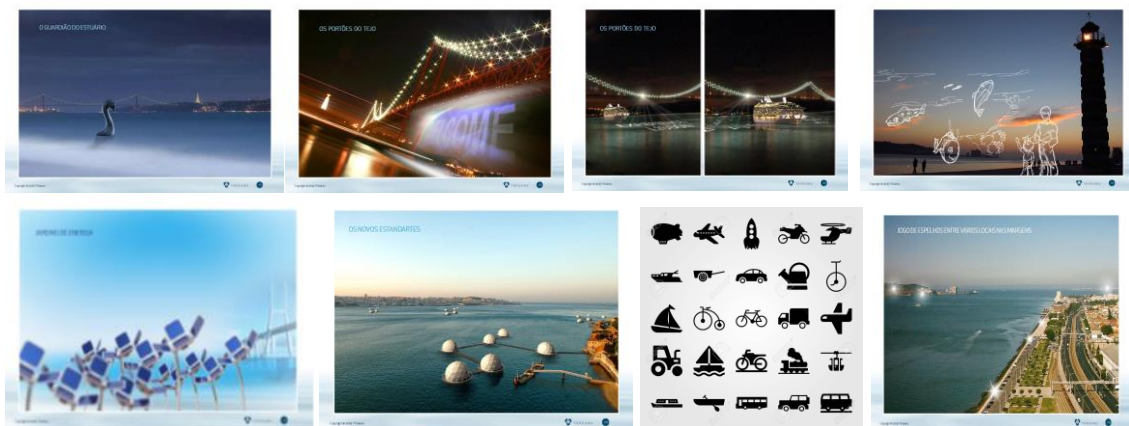

Ten years ago, [YDreams](#) was challenged by APL (the Lisbon Harbor Administration) to imagine the Tagus Estuary as a stage. We [proposed](#), with help from LNEC and others, to turn it in one of the most exciting places in the World: a living lab for art, science, technology and fun, operating as a de facto open theme park.

YDreams ideas included: The Legendary Guardian, a giant robot showing surprisingly here and there (like the Loch Ness monster); massive interactive projections and personal AR/VR experiences; energy gardens; a network of new built spaces on the water (ranging from pools to underwater studios); experimental vehicles (inspired by [English Channel](#) crossing attempts); and the use of retro communication media (such as mirrors and smoke signs) between the two River margins.



All the municipalities and public institutions involved with the Estuary supported the project. Then the crisis came to Portugal... and the Estuary is still an empty stage

AR/VR/AI/QC (or DARQ)

Very interesting week on this front. Forbes announced that [5G will be about AR and that Apple and Google will dominate](#) via hardware and software. In both, they will have competition from Asia. Note that AR (and VR) will be the interface for AI and look to [the AI showdown: Google Lens vs Bixby Vision vs Huawei HiVision](#). Recognizing objects is one of the challenges. Knowing the coordinates of the point clouds is another. [6dai](#) is doing the machine readable 3D map of the World and now they can [crowdsource a 3D space in 10 minutes](#). Douglas Rushkoff [asserts](#) that all these developments will further develop the current advertising/e-commerce nightmare. He is partially right, but he forgets that AR will enable indexing both the Real and Data Worlds, which will be revolutionary. The 2D linear Web will be replaced by a new 3D platform.

Meanwhile, Europeans (read the EU) want their [Vision Fund](#) to invest in tech. They (we) are worried because Europe is now third fiddle behind US and China. Well, Europe dominated AR in the beginning of this decade with YDreams, Metaio, Layar and Total Immersion. But there was zero vision in the Continent (except for France that tried to save Total Immersion). All the others are now transformed in or bought by North American companies. The good news is that key (formerly) YDreams talent remains in Portugal.

Most US led efforts are machine oriented, forgetting thousands of years of human recognition of objects, our own sensors and traditional mapping (and spatial analysis) knowledge (see Portugal's 500 year old tradition [here](#), password: dafundo). There are still chances.
