[Ynvisible Interactive and Innoscentia innovate on disruptive food label spoilage technology](#)

Philip Holgersson, business developer of [Ynvisible](#): “To integrate a display into a label for packaging, three things are crucial: low power consumption, which enables wireless powering, flexibility, which enables a label-like form factor, and low cost, which is a must for integration on packages. From that perspective, no other display technology can compete with ours”.

[Ynvisible](#) is now a Canadian company, listed in Toronto and Frankfurt. But its roots, and some of the key operations, are still in Portugal, where it was born as a spin-off YDreams. It also has a roll-to-roll printed electronics facility in Sweden, and a research lab in Germany.

This announcement is indicative of the company’s upside as a key player in the Internet of Things. Smart labels will be omnipresent in the logistics, luxury, food, and health industries.

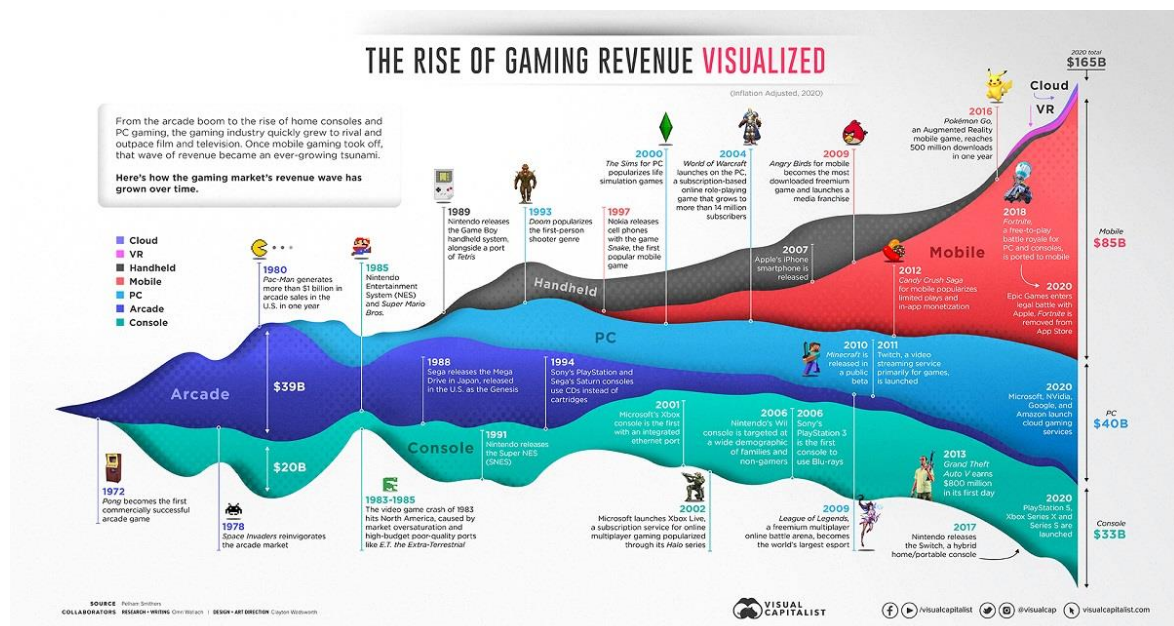
