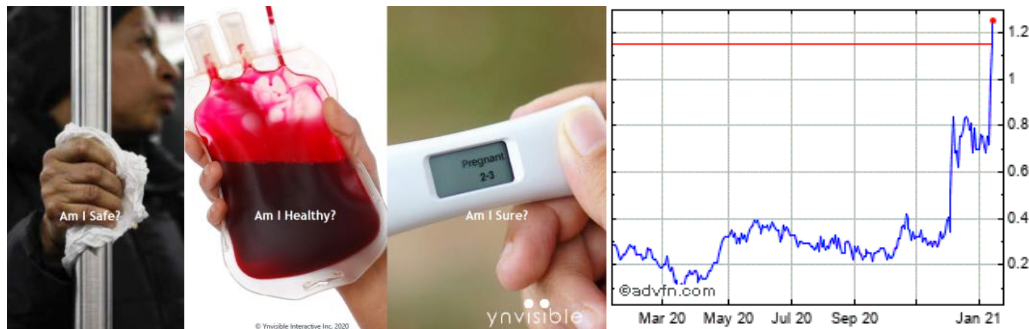

Ynvisible is a YDreams spin-off. When we started with the underlying R&D in 2007, we envisioned a huge success by CES 2013. We translated that vision in a [“fake press release”](#) for internal motivation. It took more than a decade to go from the lab to the market.

Ynvisible is now a [market leader in printed electronics](#) and has an incredible upside (and moat) in a market that will be over \$37 billion by 2025.

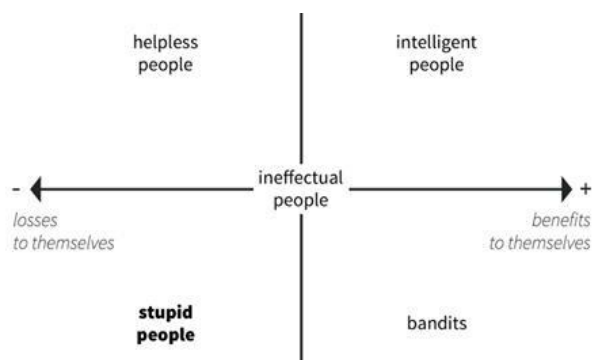

[Canesta, YDreams partner to take augmented reality mainstream](#). This was a Venture Beat article published in 2010. Canesta and YDreams were a hit at CES that year showing revolutionary ideas (see above). In July 2010, YDreams won the Auggies ahead of all the major AR companies with this [demo](#).. Canesta was bought by Microsoft and became Kinect, mid 2011. [The first Kinect public case](#) was for Nike at their Staples Center Store in LA. The occasion was the 2011 NBA All Star Game. YDreams developed it. We (Canesta and YDreams) were waiting for 2012 to be the AR boom year. It is 2021 and it looks, from the news below on AR glasses and digital twins, that we are finally close to changing from a 2D linear Web to a 3D 5G powered new Internet.
